

Past Grand Jury Reports of Jackson Memorial Hospital:

- The 1959 Fall Term looked at a complaint by a doctor related to an operation. The Grand Jury found "shortcomings which might be expected in a hospital handling such a great volume of patients, but found the overall operation of the hospital to be satisfactory."
- In the 1960 Spring term, the Grand Jury reported on a larger investigation. There were recommendations with respect to audits and problems with collections. Charity cases were already a concern for the hospital.
- In the Spring of 1964, the Grand Jury looked at how emergency patients were treated. The Jury recommended that the hospital provide explanation and guidance either by staff, or if they are too busy, a social worker.

Other Grand Jury Reports:

- In 1997, in both the Spring and Fall terms, the Grand Jury focused on the Miami-Dade County Department of Planning, Development and Regulation. This investigation concerned "favored treatment, improper actions and incorrect motivations."
- In the Spring of 2001, the Grand Jury studied and reported on "Traffic Congestion in Miami-Dade County: The Road not yet Taken."
- In Fall 2002, the Grand Jury presented "School Board of Miami-Dade County Public Schools: Issues, Policies, and Procedures." This topic was chosen after a series of articles detailing various problems and inefficiencies within the school board.
- In Fall 2003, the Grand Jury looked at Miami-Dade Aviation and issued a report: "A Call for an Independent Aviation Authority for Miami-Dade County."
- In Fall 2005, the Grand Jury issued a report titled: "House of Cards: Built on Mismanagement and Cronyism." The Grand Jury stated that the Miami-Dade Housing Agency was "an utter and complete disaster."
